### The EAST Program Assessment Survey

EAST used the Survey Monkey® application to develop and distribute the assessment survey, which included a total of 38 questions. This Appendix includes the full set of questions.

While it is not easily determined from this full PDF of the survey, there were a number of questions that resulted in the survey forking depending on the participants response. Specifically, these are:

- Question 1 Asking about participation in other shared print programs
   Yes Goes to Q2
   No Goes to Q4
- Question 10 Asking the likelihood of being an EAST member 3 years from now Likely – Goes to Q13 Unlikely – Goes to Q11
