Shared Print Monograph Summit


- Supported by Mellon Foundation grant

BookTraces

- Originally a CLIR funded project 2015-2017 at the University of Virginia
- Goal to find and record historical readers' interventions in the circulating collections of the UVA library, focusing primarily on 19th century materials in their circulating collection
- See http://www.booktraces.org/ for examples
- Clear affinities between EAST and BookTraces, although also some clear differences
- Began conversations around possible joint grant application
- Using EAST GreenGlass data to identify EAST libraries who may be candicates for further BookTraces work
- Webinars being planned for April

Monographs Update: Cohort 1

Hello EAST Cohort 1 Retention Partners -

Over the holidays OCLC/SCS updated GreenGlass to add the additional retention commitments that libraries made as part of the deeper dive into the validation study, and also to remove any lost/missing/damaged or out of scope materials which you have been reported to us. We now believe GreenGlass to be up to date, and should serve as the source of retention commitment data for registration in WorldCat. This registration process is still in pilot testing by OCLC and we will update you on specific plans for registering both the Cohort 1 and Cohort 2 retention commitments as soon as it is available.

OCLC/SCS is now beginning the process of allocating retentions to EAST Cohort 2, and will attempt to reassign lost/missing/damaged material that have been reported to us.

We will have more information on both of these projects early in the new year.

Monographs Update: Validation @Risk

Validation Study at risk titles to Cohort 2

Titles identified at risk by validation with no 2nd copy available in c1: 9,348 titles. 3,598 available and allocated to a cohort 2 library.



Monographs Update: Cohort 1 Reallocations

- Lost/missing/damaged 8,897 4,147 assigned to cohort 2
 O.C. looking at remaining 4,750 for overlap with cohort 1
- Fewer than 10 reallocation requests received so far for 2018. We'll be putting a call in May for any others

Cohort 1 libraries: You may receive requests for additional retentions in June as a result.



Reallocation Requests - 2018 / 2019

For 2018, EAST will follow a semi-annual schedule of retention reallocations.

Process reevaluated in 2019 for sustainability/functionality

At any time during the calendar year		Requests for reallocation may be submitted at any time by providing the <u>EAST Project Team</u> with a list of OCLC numbers.	
May 1st	Nov 1st	EAST Project Team reminds member libraries of June/December 1st deadline to submit reallocation requests.	
June 1st - 15th	Dec 1st - 15th	EAST staff determines which titles have surplus copies in EAST for potential reallocation.	
June 15th - July 31st	Dec 15th - Jan 31st	Operational Contacts at EAST libraries holding surplus copies are provided lists of potential additional retention requests. Libraries have 6 weeks to examine the lists and respond if they are able to take on the additional retentions. Libraries are then responsible for recording retention commitments on these titles in their ILS and WorldCat (when available). The EAST Project Team will update the EAST Retention Database.	
August 1st	Feb 1st	Libraries who submitted requests for retention reallocation are informed of the results.

GreenGlass instance for Cohort 1 expires Oct 31, 2018

Webinar in May with potential summer projects before expiration

GreenGlass instance for Cohort 2 expires June 31, 2021

A Combined instance of GreenGlass loaded with retention commitments FOR SEARCHING COLLECTIVE COLLECTION ONLY available May 2018 - until registrations available in WorldCat

Serials & Journals Update - C1 Commitments

- December 2017 February 2018, the 21 Cohort 1 Serial & Journal Retention Partners reviewed proposed retentions
- Approx. 10,000 titles confirmed for retention

 - Out of Scope:

Serials & Journals Update - Recording Commitments

- Libraries expected to record commitments in their local ILS

Working again with CRL for collection analysis, learning lessons from C1 work



Serials & Journals Update - Cohort 2 Work

- Cohort 2 libraries are currently in the process of submitting holdings data to CRL who will begin checking data and compiling collection comparison reports
- During spring and summer 2018, Cohort 2 Serial & Journal Working Group will analyze reports & develop retention rules specifically for C2 libraries
- Work with reps from C1 & C2 working groups on rules for widelyheld titles across both cohorts



EAST Future Scenario: Steady Ahead and Gathering Steam

- Developed in conjunction with EAST Executive Committee
- EAST work planned for the 12-24 months from July, 2018
- Major themes
 - Steady ahead on monograph retention
 - Full steam ahead on serials and journals
 - Further operational work
 - Outreach and communications
 - Collaboration with other shared print initiatives
- Document will be made available for comment on eastlibraries.org site in early April with webinars planned to review
