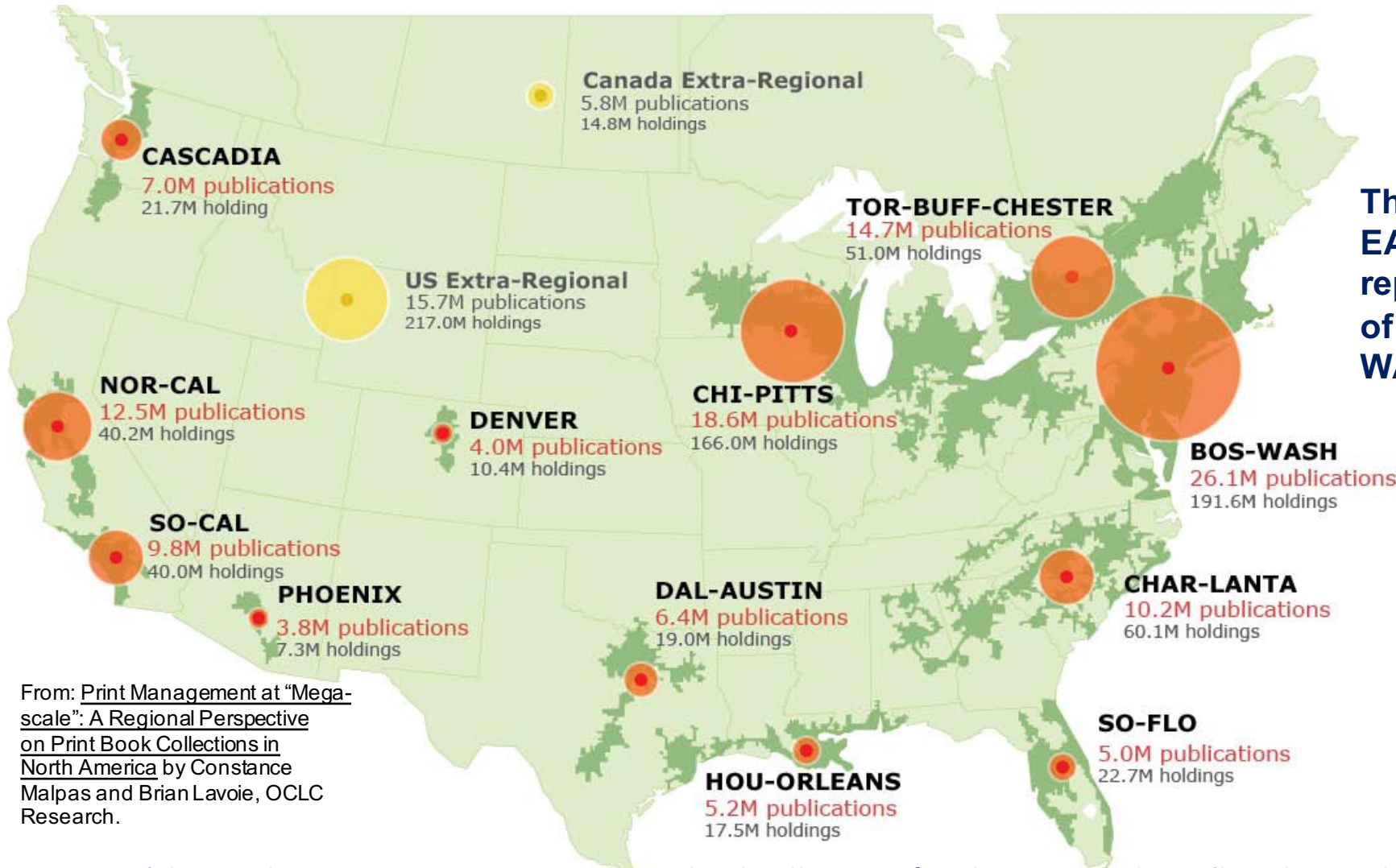

EAST – Beyond the 2 year time horizon

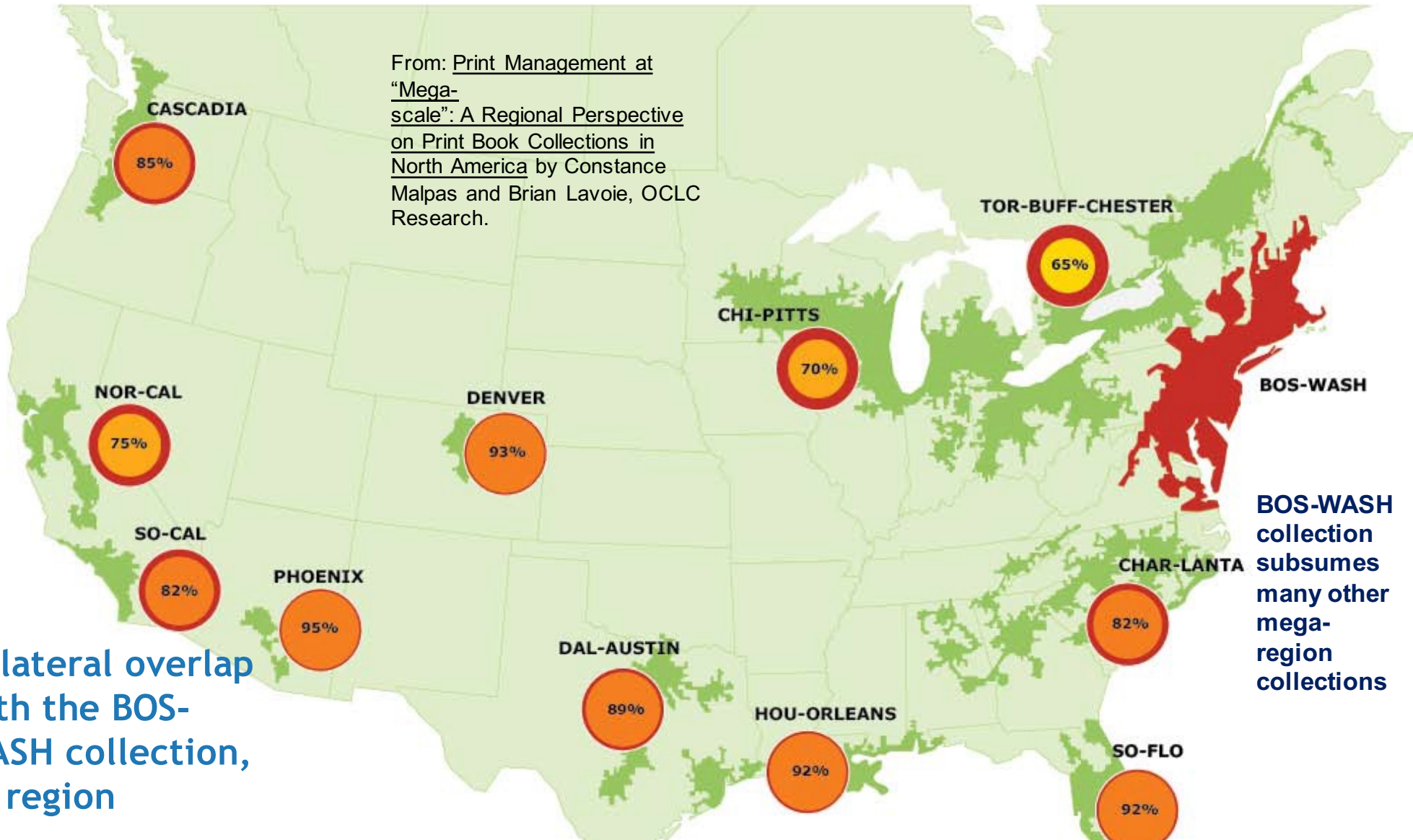


The 4.6 million EAST titles represent 18% of the BOS-WASH total.

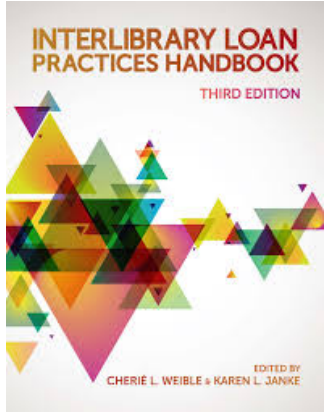


Bi-lateral overlap with the BOS-WASH collection, by region

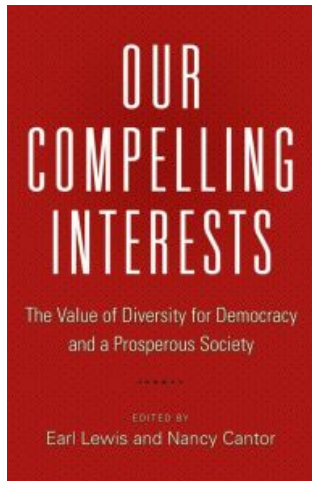

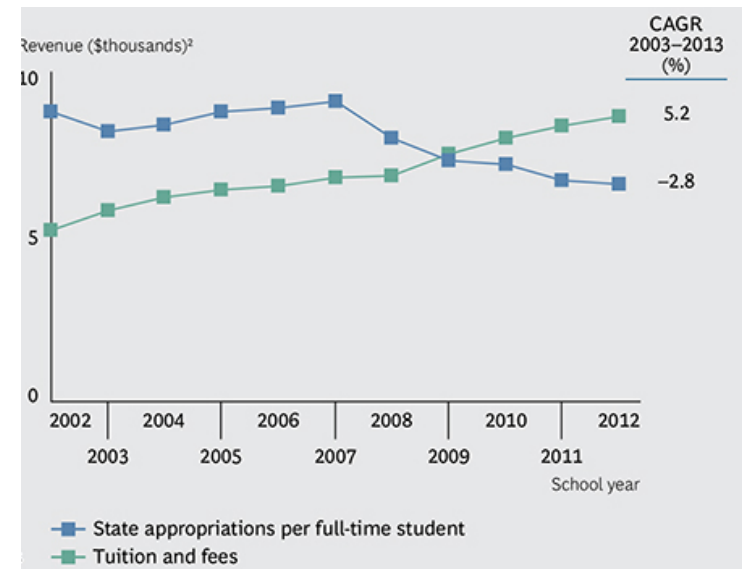

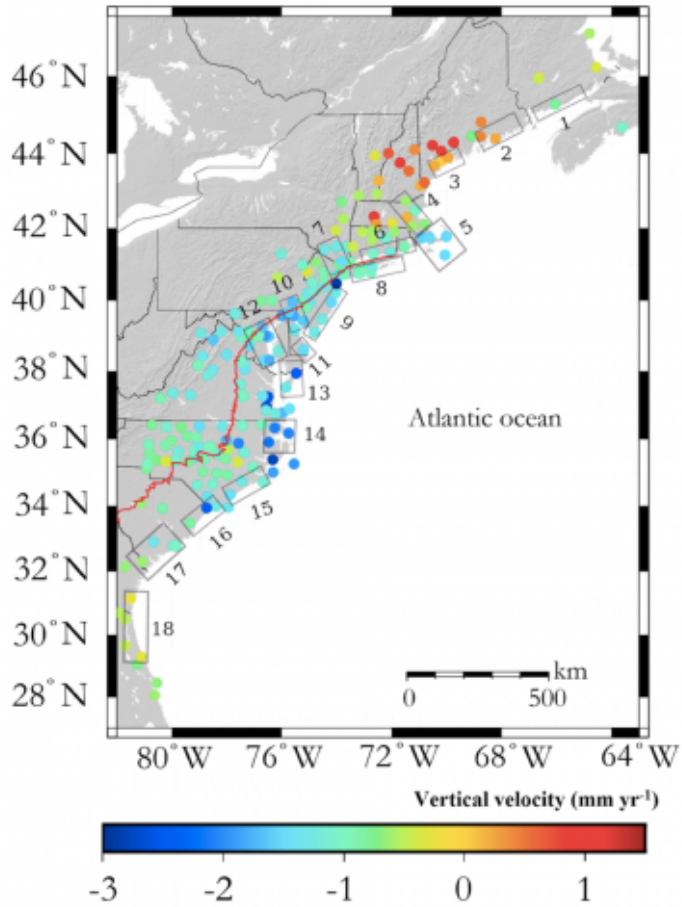
This popular phone sold 126 million models, and was particularly popular in Europe.

Storage of print materials in local collections on the Eastern seaboard could be a hazardous endeavor.

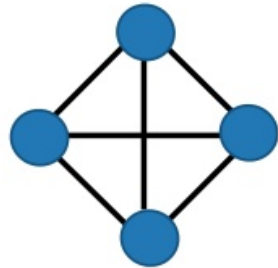
