

What is EAST?

Independent non-profit organization with the mission to

secure the print scholarly record in support of teaching, learning, and research

through a distributed shared print program*

that includes monographs with more than 11 million retained and serials with more than 37,000 retained

^{*} Shared print programs are agreements among libraries to retain certainly titles for a given period of time, often referred to as the retention period. Most programs also include some agreements relative to ensuring access to the retained titles.





EAST Core Strategy: Facilitate members' data-informed decision making about collections

Collection analysis projects support identification of

- unique titles
- widely-held titles
- outdated titles hiding in a library's collection
- titles for retention

Collection analysis projects support

- benchmarking against other collections
- Identifying gaps and strengths
- weeding activities

Providing access to the EAST Collective Collection


All member libraries have access to the EAST Collective Collection through existing resource sharing systems.

EAST ensures member libraries appear in relevant resource sharing groups (i.e., OCLC GAC, Rapid Pod, and hybrid Rapido pod coming soon!).

Resource Sharing Community of Interest brings EAST resource sharing folks together.

Using Consortial Collection Analysis for Collection Development

VIVA is Virginia's Academic Library Consortium

- 70 academic libraries.
 - 39 public (8 doctoral, 7 comprehensive, 24 2-year).
 - 31 private nonprofit.
- Central funding provided by the Commonwealth of Virginia, plus cost-sharing by members.
- Grounded in resource sharing and the coordinated collection development of e-resources.





VIVA Joins EAST in 2023

- 11 VIVA libraries joined as retention partners, all other publics are consortia supporting partners.
- Replaced VIVA's state-wide monograph retention program.
 - Resulted in smaller retention commitments for VIVA libraries.
 - Connected VIVA institutions to a larger resource sharing network.
- Included access to Gold Rush analysis tool.
 - Export VIVA holdings.
 - Compare to other EAST libraries holdings.



Context: Monographic Analysis in VIVA

2013: INTRA-Consortial Collaboration

First VIVA monographic analysis.

- No shared catalog/ILS.
- •12 institutions
- •Holdings analysis via Sustainable Collections Services, now part of OCLC.
- •Findings informed retention program, weeding, e-book strategy, negotiations, and more.


2025: INTER-Consortial Collaboration

Second monographic analysis.

- •Still no shared catalog/ILS.
- •11 EAST retention partners
- •EAST data in Gold Rush covers post-2010 holdings submitted for retention analysis.
- •Focus will be e-book strategy & prospective collection development.



VIVA's Monographic Analysis Priorities For Collection Development







Next Steps

- Top publishers: Explore patterns by library and subject area.
- Highly circulated: Figure out Gold Rush data options.
- Widely held: Break down by LC class & publisher.
- E-books:
 - Interpret findings alongside recent e-book survey results for deeper insights.
 - Compare to e-book usage in VIVA's shared collections.

Identify publishers, subjects, and acquisitions models for consortial ebook collections.









Shared Systems, Shared Capacity: Stronger Together

- Partnership Among South Carolina Academic
 Libraries (PASCAL), connecting 56 libraries across
 the state
- Members range from large research universities to small private colleges, each with different collections, budgets, and staffing levels
- PASCAL builds shared infrastructure that helps
 libraries collaborate and adapt to changing needs






Variety and Change Across Libraries

Libraries serve highly diverse missions and communities,
 creating different priorities for collections and services

 Constantly evolving environments: leadership changes, shifting budgets, and political factors influence decisions



Challenge: provide support to all members while

Collaboration Expands Capacity

 Shared systems and purchasing allow libraries to accomplish more collectively than they could individually

 Group licensing reduces cost barriers, ensures consistent statewide access, and enables patrons to move between institutions without losing access

Shared resources free local budgets for mission-specific collections








Visibility and Collaboration Through EAST

- EAST provides a statewide overview of retained print titles, supporting consistent preservation across institutions
- Helps libraries make confident decisions about weeding, even under tight timelines or administrative directives
- Participation gives all PASCAL libraries access to borrow from the EAST network at no additional cost
- Tools like Gold Rush and Alma/Primo allow libraries to analyze holdings and retention commitments, guiding purchasing and collection management decisions








OCLC Streamlined Holdings Update: Accurate Data with Less Staff Time



- SHU synchronizes member holdings with WorldCat and the shared environment to ensure consistency and accuracy
- Automated and manual updates reduce the staff time required for local maintenance
- Smaller libraries benefit from high-quality shared cataloging without needing to create original records locally
- Clean, accurate holdings data improves discovery, statewide analytics, and informed decision-making





Informed Decisions Across the Consortium

- The Impact & Advocacy Task Force develops a shared value proposition, helping libraries articulate their contributions and priorities
- Ex Libris dashboards provide insights on shared print, deselection, and retention trends, enabling evidence-based decisions
- Rialto's consortial collection development insights will allow libraries to analyze purchasing patterns across the consortium in new ways








