EAST Monograph Collection Analysis Scope and Ephemera Document Last Updated June 2024

This document describes the current scope criteria for the EAST monograph collection. Developed during the original collection analysis process in 2015, the list has been refined by subsequent new cohorts and individual members.

The document specifies the types of library materials that are out of scope for retention allocation to the EAST Retention Partners.

This ephemera list applies to print monographs in circulating collections. The following materials are currently determined to be out of scope for EAST monograph retention:

- Non circulating monographs
- Special collections and reference materials (e.g. handbooks, almanacs, dictionaries)
- Theses
- Scores
- Maps
- Government documents both US and international (Note that United Nations documents may optionally be included)
- E-books
- Media, microforms, audio/video materials
- Loose leaf material
- Serials/journals* (addressed in separate work by EAST)
- Titles published since 2011: it is expected that these recently acquired materials will not be candidates for deselection for some time.
- Juvenile literature (identified by 008/22 a,b,c or j for juvenile fiction)
- Titles considered to be "ephemera": the ephemera category is detailed further below and represents materials that were deemed to be nonscholarly and, hence, not appropriate for retention.

Multi-volume sets of monographs are in scope, though were handled slightly differently between cohorts 1 and 2. In cohort 1, retentions were assigned if only one library held the title or holdings between libraries were identical. In cohort 2 libraries were also assigned retentions if a library held a superset of all volumes held across the EAST libraries.

Note: This page refers to EAST's print monograph projects. See the <u>Serials and Journals</u> page for the scope of those projects.

EAST aims to retain all unique and scarcely held print monograph materials, and sufficient copies of widely held materials to assure preservation and access. While initially EAST only considered titles published before 2011, this has been extended to cover titles published through 2021. Libraries may also proactively add retentions on newer titles. See the <u>EAST retention models</u> for further details on retention models used in collection analysis. Note that while EAST focuses on the retention of print monographs in circulating collections, some libraries may opt in to retaining non-circulating special collections monographs if they can be made available digitally.

EAST excludes materials for which libraries are not usually willing to make long term commitments, which EAST categorizes as 'ephemera'. While libraries may opt to retain some of these types of materials, they are not required to do so. The following types of materials are currently determined to be out of scope for monograph retention:


- Reference materials (e.g. handbooks, almanacs, dictionaries)
- · Computer manuals and guides
- · Leisure materials such as travel and hobby guides
- Juvenile literature
- · Test prep materials (e.g. LSAT, GRE)
- · Textbooks and instructional materials
- Theses
- Scores
- Maps
- Loose leaf material
- Government documents both US and international (United Nations documents may optionally be included)
- · All non print formats, e.g. e-books, microforms, audio/video materials and other media



EAST and SCELC - IMLS Planning Grant

Overview

- 2-year project to identify ways to enhance the diversity of institutional participants and collections in their respective shared print programs
- Community Council to provide feedback, guidance, and advice
- Justification
 - Highlight value shared print can offer MSIs and HBCUs
 - Contribute to the overall preservation of a diverse and inclusive collection

Research Questions

- Do HBCU book collections reflect the community they serve?
- Do HBCUs own books about their communities that are not held by other shared print participants?
- Do HBCU retention commitments reflect the community they serve?




FAST vs LCSH

- Faceted metadata based on LCSH
- More comprehensive than LCSH analysis
- Incorporates an expanded list of headings across LC class numbers (i.e., across disciplines)




FAST vs. LC Class Number Analysis - African Americans


Using standard LC Class Headings is limited to classes D, E, and P




FAST Headings identify titles across the range of LC Classes

Based on number of titles held by HBCU's as compared to the paired PWI institutions.



Colby, Hathi Pilot 3, unique non-circulating items

Colby College, 2200 FTE, private 4-year liberal arts; Waterville, Maine (rural), -900,000 total monographs; +600,000 have retention commitments.

We are members of three print retention programs:

- MSCC,
- EAST
- Hathitrust

Special Collections: six full time staff positions (three MLS); Annex has appropriate collections to pull from as well. Focus on outreach, teaching and community engagement.

To make it super interesting, we were migrating from Sierra to Alma after 30+ years with iii products


Pilot 3 @ Hathitrust: 2021 Colby joined the Pilot 3 group focused on

- non-circulating materials digitized in HathiTrust
- materials were in the public domain
- only 1–2 members reported as holding these items so unique across HT's membership

Frequent group meetings to norm definitions, system requirements, scope of work.

Shared Print Policies Retention Libraries participating in Phase 3, required to follow validation requirements for metadata, inventory confirmation, and physical condition.

Heather made it easy—gave us a list to select from, encouraged us to work with Special Collections.


- We don't share one system





What Shapes My Thinking Around Shared Print?

"The future of print collections is shared" - CCH Collaboration Vision


- Shared print is part of the entire lifecycle of collections
- Establish mutual understanding and trust
- Encompass different voices and stakeholders
- Sustainability through an ecosystem





The <u>Rosemont Shared Print Alliance</u> and the Partnership for Shared Book Collections were separate organizations focused on ensuring the retention of and access to print journal backfiles and monographs respectively. As of July 1st, 2024, they have formed a single entity known as the <u>Shared Print Partnership</u>. The following year will serve as a bridge to finalize the scope and mission of this new organization, with work being guided by a <u>bridge year executive committee</u>.





HathiTrust's Shared Print Program

Goals:

- Ensure preservation of print and digital collections
- Reduce overall costs of collection management for HathiTrust members
- Catalyze national/international collective management of collections





HathiTrust's Shared Print Program

As of 2024:

- 79 retention libraries participating in HathiTrust Shared Print Program
- 18,418,030 single-part monographs
- 5,614,024 individual titles

Expand and Diversify the Collection


We will expand the volume and diversity of book and serial content in the HathiTrust collection.

We will reinforce our technological and operational foundations to preserve and steward the HathiTrust collection responsibly, sustainably, and effectively.








Next Steps - HathiTrust's Shared Print Program's Collection Policy and Strategy
